EMPLOYMENT AUTHORIZATION DOCUMENT (EAD) (I-766)

Let This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.	The purpose of this Policy Bulletin is to inform Cash Assistance (CA) and Non-Cash Assistance (NCA) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) staff about updated code usages on the Employment Authorization Document (EAD) (I-766).
	The I-766 , which is issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) agency, provides evidence that an immigrant is authorized to be employed in the United States by a United States employer.
	Formerly, an alpha numeric code beginning with a lower case letter (e.g., a1, b2, c3, etc.) was used on the I-766 to indicate an individual's immigration status.
Note : Staff may still see older cards with the lower case alpha numeric.	USCIS now designates an individual's immigration status on the I-766 through the use of three position alpha numeric codes beginning with capital letters A, B, or C (e.g., A05, B03, C09, etc.).
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New alpha numeric code with Capital letters	SERVES AS 1-512 ADVANCE PAROLE
