### 2013 FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL GUIDELINES FOR EAF AND ESNA CATEGORIES OF ASSISTANCE (EXP-76D)

<b>Date:</b> March 28, 2013	<b>Subtopic(s):</b> Forms, Income, Eligibility
<p> This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.</p> <p>See PD #08-43-ELI for the EAF procedure.</p>	<p>The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform all Job Center staff that the Federal Poverty Level Guidelines for Emergency Assistance to Families (EAF) and Emergency Safety Net Assistance (ESNA) Categories of Assistance (<b>EXP-76D</b>) form has been revised to reflect the 2013 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines.</p> <p>The 200% Federal Poverty Level Guidelines and the 125% Federal Poverty Level Guidelines that are listed on the <b>EXP-76D</b> are applied when a request for EAF or ESNA is made. The 2013 Federal Poverty Guidelines are effective April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014 for EAF and ESNA requests.</p> <p>In order for a household to be financially eligible for EAF, the household's immediately available income on the date of application must be at or below the 200% Federal Poverty Level for their household size and the applicant must not have available resources to meet the emergency need.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Workers are reminded that they must explore eligibility for ESNA in instances in which a household is deemed ineligible for assistance under the EAF category.</p> <p>In order for a household to be financially eligible for ESNA, the household's total monthly gross income (regardless of its availability) must be at or below the 125% Federal Poverty Level for their household size.</p>

Job Center Directors must ensure that the newly revised **EXP-76D** is used to determine financial eligibility for EAF and ESNA requests made on or after April 1, 2013. Job Center Directors must retain one copy of the March 29, 2012 version of Form **EXP-76D** for use in determining financial eligibility for EAF/ESNA requests made prior to April 1, 2013. All other copies of previous versions of Form **EXP-76D** must be removed from circulation and recycled.
