CHILD CARE MARKET RATES EFFECTIVE 4/1/2014

Subtopic(s):
Child care, ACCIS
The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform Job Center staff of the change in the child care market rates that go into effect on April 1, 2014. It is informational for all other staff.
The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) establishes new maximum child care market rates every two years. The child care market rate determines the maximum amount that the Agency can pay to providers who care for children eligible for a child care subsidy. The 2014 market rates will be effective on April 1, 2014. These current rates are listed on the attached Maximum Child Care Rates form (W-667F).
Staff must use the W-667F to determine the maximum rate applicable to the type of provider used. JOS/Child Care Specialists must apply the new market rates when entering <u>new</u> legally-exempt child care providers in the Automated Child Care Information System (ACCIS). The actual amount requested by the provider can be paid up to the maximum child care rate shown.
JOS/Child Care Specialists cannot make any rate changes for providers already active in ACCIS. Only New York City Children's Services (ACS) can update the rates of all active providers in the ACCIS. All rate change requests must be made to ACS and ACS will update the rate if the increase is justified. A provider cannot increase his/her rates just because of the increase in the child care market rate.
