DHS DIRECTORS MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Oxygen Tanks in DHS Congregate Facilities and Programs

Effective immediately and notwithstanding any prior conflicting policies, clients presenting with oxygen tanks <u>must be permitted</u> to bring their oxygen tanks inside DHS Single Adult Shelters, Drop-in Centers, Stabilization Beds, and Safe Havens.

A client's request for a Reasonable Accommodation (RA) to bring an oxygen tank into any of these facilities <u>must be provisionally granted</u>. Facility staff must follow the process outlined below.

- Facility staff must immediately notify their Program Administrator (PA) if a client presents with an oxygen tank.
- Facility staff must immediately provide clients presenting with oxygen tanks a Reasonable Accommodation Request Form (<u>DHS-13</u>) to be completed and submitted to the PA.
- If the client submits their prescription and oxygen tank delivery schedule, the PA must approve the RA to utilize an oxygen tank, if applicable
- If the client fails to provide the relevant documentation after receiving assistance from shelter staff, the PA may administratively deny the RA to utilize an oxygen tank.
- PAs and Facility Directors must consult directly with their Assistant Commissioner in Adult Services or Street Homeless Solutions (SHS) at DHS on all cases involving oxygen tanks.
- PAs must notify the Office of Disability Affairs and the Office of Legal Affairs of any case involving oxygen tanks.
