### VIETNAM VETERAN BENEFIT PAYMENT DISREGARDS

<p> <input type="checkbox"/> This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.         </p> <p>           VA Payments for disabilities resulting from Spina bifida             Revised Information         </p> <p>           VA Payments for covered birth defects             Revised Information         </p>	<p> <b>Revisions to Original Policy Bulletin:</b> </p> <p>           This policy bulletin has been revised to correct the statements that Veterans Administration (VA) payments for disabilities resulting from Spina bifida and covered birth defects extend to all Safety Net Assistance (SNA) cases. They should state that such payments extend only to SNA <u>family cases</u>.         </p> <p> <b>Purpose:</b> </p> <p>           The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform staff of two changes in regulations concerning the disregard of certain Veterans Administration (VA) benefits received by Vietnam veterans. The changes are effective retroactive to December 10, 2003.         </p> <p>           Currently, for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) cases, VA payments to Vietnam veterans' natural adult or minor children for any disability resulting from spina bifida are excluded as income and resources when determining eligibility or degree of need for Public Assistance. A change in regulation now extends the exclusion of these VA payments to include Safety Net Assistance (SNA) <u>family cases</u>.         </p> <p>           A second change extended to SNA <u>families</u> and TANF cases involves VA payments for covered birth defects to or on behalf of the adult or minor biological children of female Vietnam veterans who served in the Republic of Vietnam from February 28, 1961 through May 7, 1975. These VA payments are disregarded as income or resources in determining eligibility or degree of need for SNA families and federally funded public assistance benefits.         </p>

Implications

A covered birth defect is defined as any birth defect identified by the Veterans Administration that is associated with the service of female Vietnam veterans during the above period that resulted in or may result in a permanent physical or mental disability.

The VA payments referred to above are also excluded as both an income and resource when determining eligibility for Food Stamps and/or Medicaid/Family Health Plus.

If the household is currently being budgeted for these types of VA payments, the income must be removed and the household must be supplemented for PA and FS benefits retroactive to December 10, 2003.

If the household reports the receipt of VA payments or this income is discovered via a computer match, the Worker must determine if the payment is for a disability resulting from spina bifida, or a covered birth defect to or on behalf of the adult or minor biological child of a female Vietnam veteran who served in Vietnam during the periods mentioned above. If it is determined that the income is to be excluded, no further action is required.
