2006 FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL GUIDELINES (EXP-76D)

Date: March 24, 2006	Subtopic(s): Forms			
☐ This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.	The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform staff at the Job/Model Centers that the 2005 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines form (EXP-76D) has been revised to reflect the 2006 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines, which take effect April 1, 2006.			
	The Federal Poverty Level Guidelines on the EXP-76D are applied when a request for Emergency Assistance to Families (EAF) or Emergency Safety Net Assistance (ESNA) is made.			
See PD #05-02-ELI	In order for the household (H/H) to be financially eligible for EAF, the H/H's available income on the date of application must be at or below 200 percent of the current Federal poverty level for that H/H size and the applicant must be without the resources to meet the emergency need.			
	Note: Workers are reminded they must explore eligibility for ESNA in instances where a H/H applying for EAF is deemed ineligible.			
	To be financially eligible for ESNA, the H/H's gross income at the time of application must not exceed 125 percent of the Federal poverty level guideline for that H/H size.			
	A sample of the form is attached.			
	Center Directors must ensure that all previous versions of this form are recycled.
