Date: June 3, 2010	Subtopic(s): Childcare, Day Camp
<p> This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.</p>	<p>The purpose of this policy bulletin is to provide staff with information regarding New York City summer camps. Summer camp is often a necessity for working parents and can be a great experience for children.</p> <p>The New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) requires that all summer camps are permitted and inspected every year in order to protect the health and safety of children attending summer camp in New York City. A searchable directory of summer camps is available online at:</p> <p>http://www.nyc.gov/html/doh/html/camp/campmn.shtml?z=all&t=all&s=all&p=all&submit=Submit</p> <p>Individuals can search for camps online by borough, zip code, and type of camp. The online directory is continuously updated throughout the summer, so individuals should continue to check the directory if they are unable to find a camp that meets their needs. A hard copy of this directory, The Guide to Finding a Summer Camp in New York City 2010, has been created and distributed by DOHMH. This guide is also posted to the FIAweb under Reference Material.</p> <p>Additionally, individuals can search for camps on the Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) website at www.nyc.gov/dycd.
