## **REVISIONS TO THE PRUCOL ELIGIBILITY DESK AID (W-205JJ)**

Date: November 4, 2016	Subtopic(s): Eligibility
This procedure can now be accessed on the FIAweb.	The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform staff of significant changes made to the Permanently Residing Under the Color of Law (PRUCOL) Eligibility Desk Aid ( <b>W-205JJ</b> ). Some changes have been made to the formatting of the <b>W-205JJ</b> to make it easier to use the Desk Aid, while other changes include new immigration statuses that did not previously appear on the <b>W-205JJ</b> .
Please refer to the Alien Eligibility Desk Aid ( <u>LDSS-</u> <u>4579</u> ) for the "qualified alien" criteria	Some noncitizens who do not meet the Federal "qualified alien" criteria may be eligible for certain New York State funded benefits if they can be considered PRUCOL. For Cash Assistance (CA), noncitizens are considered to be PRUCOL by the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) if they are present in the United States (US) with the knowledge and permission or acquiescence of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS) and the USCIS is allowing the noncitizens to reside in the country for an indefinite period of time. The State Department of Health has slightly different standards for PRUCOL eligibility for Medicaid (MA). PRUCOL is neither an immigration status nor a term of immigration law but a public benefit eligibility category. Individuals found eligible under this category may receive only Safety Net Assistance (SNA) and/or state funded Medicaid (MA). They are not eligible for Family Assistance (FA), Safety Net Federally Participating (SNFP), and Emergency Assistance for Families (EAF) or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

The standards for PRUCOL eligibility used for SNA and MA are slightly different. Consult the PRUCOL Eligibility Desk Aid (**W-205JJ**) for differences and instructions for what to do when eligibility is not clear.

**Note:** If it is determined that a noncitizen is not eligible for CA because of his/her immigration status, staff must deny the individual using the appropriate denial code (**F92 - Failure to Provide Proof of Citizenship or Eligible Alien Status)** and Alien Citizenship Indicator (ACI) code "**E**" (Non-qualified aliens eligible for emergency Medicaid). Use of the appropriate denial code ensures a Medicaid Separate Determinations (MSD) is conducted as CA and MA PRUCOL eligibility rules differ.

## **Revisions to the Original Policy Bulletin and Desk Aid:**

The PRUCOL Eligibility Desk Aid Form **W-205JJ** has been revised as follows:

- The header of the form is modified to emphasize that individuals with PRUCOL status are not eligible for SNAP or FA benefits.
- The Relevant Date for Eligibility column is eliminated as it only applied to one of the categories.
- The <u>Form I-688B</u> was made obsolete and replaced by the <u>Form I-766</u> as per OTDA directions.
- For the status of "Order of Supervision":
  - The <u>Form I-94</u> is removed from common documentation as this form is not known to be a commonly used document for this status; and
  - A note about Cuban/Haitian Entrants was added instructing staff to request a clearance from the Office of Refugee and Immigrant Affairs (ORIA).
- References to sections of law in the column "Description of Status" are removed for easier readability.
- For the "Granted Deferred Action" status:
  - The **Form I-797** is removed; and
  - Any letter from USCIS granting deferred status to a "U" visa applicant is added.
- The status of "Granted a 'K3', 'K4' visa" is combined with the status of a "V" visa and:
  - The unexpired visa should be in the passport; and
  - The codes A09, A14 and A15 are added to the Form I-766.

٠	For the "Granted a 'U' visa" status the <b>Form I-797</b> should
	indicate that a petition for U nonimmigrant status was
	approved.

- For the status of "Continuous entry and residence in the US prior to January 1, 1972" the **Form I-485** is removed.
- For the status of "Applicant for Asylum" the intent to approve asylum request is removed and the code **C08** is added to the **Form I-766**.
- For the status of "Granted Temporary Protected Status (TPS) individuals are now eligible for SNA under PRUCOL.
- For the status of "Applicant for Temporary Protected Status" the <u>Form I-797</u> with indication of a pending application for Temporary Protected Status is added.
- For the status of "Applicant for Adjustment of Status" the codes C09 and C09P in the Form I-766 are added as our staff commonly see these codes on the work authorization cards. Also the Worker must ask the applicants/participants on what basis they are seeking adjustment of status and check the prior status on both the Alien Desk Aid and the PRUCOL Desk Aid.
- A reminder on the prior version of the **W-205JJ** has been removed as it was not relevant for FIA staff.
- The last two statuses on the Form W-205JJ were removed or consolidated in other statuses. These statuses are:
  - Persons who have filed applications for adjustments of status under Section 245 of the INA and the USCIS has accepted as "properly filed"; and
  - Any aliens living in the US with knowledge and permission or acquiescence of the USCIS and whose departure the Agency does not contemplate enforcing.

There are five additional statuses added to the Form **W-205JJ** with the common documentation associated with each status. Some of these statuses were not in existence at the time the prior **W-205JJ** was published, while others were simply omitted and are now being included. These statuses are:

- Granted Special Immigrant Juvenile Status;
- Granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Status;
- Applicants for DACA Status;
- Applicants for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status; and
- Applicants for Cancellation of Removal Status.

New information

New information	A note that if ACI code is "E", a Medicaid separate determination must be done as Medicaid PRUCOL eligibility rules differ than SNA eligibility rules.
New information	The worker must contact ORIA at (212) 331-4550 if:
	<ul> <li>The noncitizen lives in the US with knowledge and permission or acquiescence of the USCIS; and</li> <li>The USCIS does not contemplate enforcing the departure of the noncitizen for an indefinite period of time; and</li> <li>The status of the noncitizen does not fit in any of the other categories of the W-205JJ</li> </ul>
	ORIA will make the determination if the noncitizen meets the criteria for PRUCOL status. Staff are no longer to contact OTDA directly.
New information	A new section has been added to the <b>W-205JJ</b> to remind staff how noncitizen cases must be processed.
	To make an accurate eligibility determination the staff must:
Refer to PB #07-82-OPE	<ul> <li>Ask applicants/participants to provide all documentation they have and to consider all of the documents submitted.</li> <li>Scan and index all immigration documents. Scan all sides and all pages of passports including blank pages, front and back of cards, legibly and in color in the HRA OneViewer.</li> <li>Consult the Alien Eligibility Desk Aid (LDSS-4579) first. If you do not find the documentation the applicant/participant presented, then look to the PRUCOL Desk Aid. If you do not find the documentation on both desk aids, contact ORIA at oria@hra.nyc.gov or (212)313-4550.</li> <li>The form W-205JJ must be used in conjunction with the Paperless Office System (POS) Alien Checklist Module in order to ensure correctness of action.</li> </ul>
Refer to PD #14-26-SYS Refer to PD # 15-09-ELI	<ul> <li>Request a Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) search for any noncitizen members of the household who do not present themselves as undocumented. ### Quick Tips:

This is a guide. Staff may see documents that are not on this guide. If you have a document that is not on this guide, check the Alien Eligibility Desk Aid and the POS Alien Checklist Module. If you still cannot find the document, call ORIA for a clearance.

All staff:

- Ask applicants/participants to provide all documentation they have and consider all of the documents you receive.
- Scan and index all immigration documents. Scan all sides and all pages of passports including blank pages, front and back of cards, legibly and in color in the HRA OneViewer (**PB 07-82-OPE**).
- Consult the Alien Eligibility Desk Aid (LDSS-4579) first. If you do not find the documentation the client presented, then look to the PRUCOL Desk Aid. If you do not find the documentation on both desk aids, contact ORIA at oria@hra.nyc.gov or (212) 331-4550.
- Request a SAVE search for any noncitizen members of the household who do not present themselves as undocumented. For any documentation that shows a pending application, check with USCIS.GOV for current case updates (PD-15-09-ELI)
- Individuals may still be eligible for public benefits if they do not have a Social Security number (PB-16-20-OPE and PD-12-22-ELI).
- If you are unsure about an individual's eligibility for benefits, contact ORIA. For a clearance, email the ORIA-195 (ORIA Clearance Request) to oria@hra.nyc.gov after you have scanned and indexed all immigration documents and filled out and scanned the SAVE referral form (W-515X).
- If applicant/participant is Cuban/Haitian, a clearance request must be sent to ORIA along with all the documents that have been scanned and indexed.
