COVID-19 EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM ALLOTMENTS FOR JUNE 2020

Date:	Subtopic(s):
June 16, 2020	COVID-19 SNAP Supplements
	The purpose of this policy bulletin is to inform staff that emergency Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits will be issued by the Office of Temporary Disability and Assistance (OTDA) to certain households who were issued benefits for June 2020.
	The benefits will be issued as a result of the March 18, 2020 enactment of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act of 2020.
	Households who were issued SNAP benefits for June 2020 and whose issuance was less than the maximum allotment for their household size, will be issued a supplement by OTDA for the difference between the maximum allotment and the amount they were issued. This includes SNAP cases that are currently closed.
	For example, if a SNAP household of two people was issued \$237 for June 2020, the household will be issued a supplement of \$118 because the maximum allotment for two people is \$355.
	SNAP households are eligible for the supplement even if they only received a pro-rated benefit for June 2020 because they applied for SNAP benefits after June 1st.
	The SNAP supplements will be issued on a staggered basis from 6/15/2020 through 6/26/2020 based on the toe digit of the case.
	The SNAP benefit supplements for CA/SNAP cases will be issued using single issuance code 20 . The SNAP benefit supplements for NCA SNAP cases will be issued using single issuance code 22 .
	The unique authorization number for these payments is 20200113 .

Call 718-557-1313 then press 3 at the prompt followed by 1 or send an e-mail to *FIA Call Center Fax* or fax to: (917) 639-0298 OTDA will continue to search for cases that were issued a June 2020 SNAP benefit that was for less than the maximum allotment for their household size. These households are eligible for the supplement even if they were not identified in the initial run. For example, households who were issued a pro-rated June 2020 SNAP benefit after the initial run, are still eligible for the supplement. Once found, these households will be issued a supplement by OTDA.

The maximum SNAP benefit allotments by household size are listed on the attached Guide to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Budgeting (**W-204G**).

An exception report will be sent by OTDA to the Family Independence Administration (FIA) that will list the cases that were unable to be automatically issued the emergency SNAP supplement.

The **LDSS-5167** was revised by OTDA.

OTDA has revised the Notice to All Recipients of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (LDSS-5167) as a public notice that must be displayed in Job Centers and SNAP Centers until June 30, 2020. The notice will not be mailed to SNAP households.

In addition, OTDA has created the Frequently Asked Questions for the Emergency Allotment of SNAP Benefits (**Attachment A**).

Frequently Asked Questions for the Emergency Allotment of SNAP Benefits


Answers to many commonly asked questions about the Supplemental Emergency Allotment (EA) of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Benefits.

What are supplemental EA SNAP benefits?

The Families First Act (FFA) is a federal law that was passed to respond to the effects of the public health emergency caused by COVID-19. The law authorized the issuance of emergency supplemental benefits to households receiving SNAP. Based on the law, states are to issue supplemental SNAP benefits, **up to the maximum allowable SNAP benefit for a household's size**, during the emergency or disaster declaration. New York is issuing the supplemental benefits for the months of March, April, May and June 2020. Only households whose SNAP benefit **for** the months of March, April, May and/or June was **less than** the maximum benefit amount for their household's size will get a supplemental EA SNAP benefit.

Who qualifies for the supplemental EA SNAP benefits?

If your household received a SNAP benefit for March, April, May and/or June that was **less than** the maximum benefit amount for your household's size, then you qualify for, and will automatically get, a supplemental EA SNAP benefit. The maximum monthly SNAP benefit amounts by household size are listed below:



What if my household already got the maximum benefit for my household's size for March, April, May and/or June?

If you got the maximum SNAP benefit for your household's size for March, April, May and/or June, then you will **not** get a supplemental EA SNAP benefit for the month you receive the maximum benefit.

How much will I receive in supplemental EA SNAP benefits?

SNAP households are eligible to receive supplemental EA SNAP benefits for March, April, May and/or June 2020 in the amount that will bring them up to the maximum SNAP monthly benefit amount for a household of their size.

For example, a household of 4 people may currently receive a maximum monthly allotment of \$646. If that household received \$400 in monthly SNAP benefits, they will receive supplemental EA SNAP benefits of \$246.

Do I need to apply for supplemental EA SNAP benefits?

No, you do **not** need to apply for supplemental EA SNAP benefits. If you already get SNAP and received a SNAP benefit for March, April, May and/or June that is **less than** the maximum benefit amount for your household's size, the EA benefits automatically will be made available on your EBT card.

If you are **not** currently enrolled in SNAP, the quickest way to apply for SNAP benefits is online at: <u>www.myBenefits.ny.gov/</u> or <u>https://access.nyc.gov/</u> (if you live in New York City).

When will I receive my emergency SNAP benefits if I am eligible?

Supplemental EA SNAP benefits for June will be available on you EBT card by July 4, 2020. If you were eligible for supplemental EA SNAP benefits in March, April and/or May, they were made available on your EBT card by the end of May. What can I purchase with my emergency SNAP supplemental benefits?

The supplemental EA benefits are SNAP benefits. Like regular SNAP benefits, the supplemental benefits can be used to purchase food at authorized retail food stores. A detailed list of food items that may be purchased with SNAP benefits can be found at: http://www.fns.usda.gov/snap/eligible-food-items/.

Do I have to use my emergency SNAP supplemental benefits right away?

No. Unused SNAP benefits, including supplements, remain available and accessible on your EBT card for up to one year from the date they are issued.



NOTICE TO ALL RECIPIENTS OF Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) IMPORTANT! PLEASE READ!

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) will automatically issue an Emergency supplemental SNAP benefit to households not already receiving the maximum benefit. This action is part of a provision set forth by the Families First Corona Virus Response Act of 2020. Households currently not receiving the maximum benefit will receive the Emergency supplemental SNAP benefit to increase their current benefit amount to the maximum amount for their household size. New York State OTDA will issue the Emergency supplemental benefits to all SNAP households **NOT** already receiving the maximum benefit for the month of June 2020.

Households who already received the maximum benefit amount for their household size in June 2020 are not eligible for this supplement.

Eligible Cases: SNAP cases that received benefits in June 2020 and did not receive the maximum benefit amount for their household size, will receive the supplemental SNAP benefit.

Supplements will be automatically issued and available on your EBT card. You do <u>NOT</u> have to apply for or contact your local office about these supplements.

Note: This is a one-time payment. Recipients will receive their regular SNAP benefit amount beginning in July. There is no right to a fair hearing for those receiving their regular benefit in July that is less than the maximum benefit solely because they are no longer receiving the supplemental allotment.

130% GROSS INCOME LIMITS (effective 10/01/19)

Households that <u>do not</u> contain an elderly (60 years of age or older) or disabled individual <u>and do not</u> incur out-of-pocket dependent care expenses <u>and do not</u> have earned income are subject to the 130% gross income test.

165% GROSS INCOME LIMITS (effective 10/01/19)

An elderly individual (and his/her spouse) who is living with others and who is unable to purchase and prepare meals because he/she suffers from a permanent disability may be a separate food unit if the income of the others with whom the individual resides (excluding the income of the elderly individual and his/her spouse) does not exceed the 165% gross income limit for the household size of the others.

200% GROSS INCOME LIMITS (effective 10/01/19)

Households that contain an elderly or disabled individual or that incur out-of-pocket dependent care expenses that pass the 200% gross income test are categorically eligible to participate in SIMP as long as the household does not contain a SNAP-sanctioned or an Intentional Program Violation (IPV) member.

150% GROSS INCOME LIMITS (effective 10/01/19)

Households that have earned income that <u>do not</u> contain an elderly or disabled individual <u>and do not</u> incur out-of-pocket dependent care expenses that pass the 150% gross income test are categorically eligible to participate in SNAP as long as the household does not contain a SNAP sanctioned or an IPV member.

Households that are not categorically eligible to receive SNAP benefits are subject to the 100% net income test.
