The NYS Department of Health, Office of Medicaid Management will host the Medicaid Buy-In for Working People with Disabilities (MBI-WPD) Statewide Conference - "Building Community Partnerships". The conference will be held on Tuesday, November 9, 2004 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center.

The conference goal is to bring consumers, state agencies, stakeholders and local departments of social services' staff together to share best practices and effective strategies in assisting disabled individuals overcome barriers to employment. Mr. Hockenberry is the author of "Moving Violations: War Zones, Wheelchairs and Declarations of Independence," a memoir of life as a foreign correspondent, which was a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award in 1996.

Local District Commissioners are encouraged to send Medicaid eligibility staff, Medicaid disability staff and other appropriate staff. Medicaid Infrastructure Grant (MIG) funds are available to reimburse LDSS staff for their mileage at the State rate of .375/mile. Staff seeking reimbursement for mileage expenses should indicate the approximate cost on their registration form. Hotel accommodations will not be reimbursed.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

JOHN HOCKENBERRY

Dateline NBC

Three-time Peabody Award winner, four-time Emmy award winner and Dateline NBC correspondent, John Hockenberry has broad experience as a journalist and commentator for more than two decades. He has reported from all over the world, in virtually every medium, having anchored programs for network, cable and radio. Hockenberry was responsible for two of the most innovative programs to air on MSNBC. The program "Hockenberry" was a smart provocative news interview program which broadcast live from the war in Kosovo in 1999, while "Edgewise" was a unique blend of raw documentary filmmaking and interviews with newsmakers passionate about politics and culture.

Hockenberry joined NBC as a correspondent for *Dateline NBC* in January 1996 after a fifteen-year career in broadcast news at both National Public Radio and ABC News. Hockenberry's reporting for *Dateline NBC* earned him three Emmys, an Edward R Murrow award and a Casey Medal. His most prominent *Dateline NBC* reports include an hour-long documentary on the often-fatal tragedy of the medically uninsured, an emotionally gripping portrait of a young schizophrenic trying to live on his own, and extensive reporting in the aftermath of September 11th.



Coming From The:

North: Take Interstate 87 (Northway) to Interstate 90 East exit. Proceed East to Interstate 787 South and take the Empire State Plaza exit. Follow signs to Visitors' Parking Area.

South: Take the NYS Thruway (Interstate 87) to Exit 23 (Albany). Proceed straight through the toll booth to Interstate 787 North. Take the Empire State Plaza exit and follow signs to Visitors' Parking Area.

East: Take Interstate 90 and cross the Hudson River. Take exit to Interstate 787 South, along the river. Take the Empire State Plaza exit and follow signs to Visitors' Parking Area.

West: Take the NYS Thruway to Exit 24 (Albany). Proceed East on Interstate 90 to Interstate 787 South. Take the Empire State Plaza exit and follow signs to Visitors' Parking Area.

Visitors' Parking is available in the V Lot only. Elevators will take you to the concourse level of the Empire State Plaza. The NYS Convention Center is located off the main concourse below the Performing Arts Center (the "Egg").
