I. Purpose

- □ To inform local districts that the January 1, 2007 cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for RSDI (regular and disability Social Security benefits) and SSI has been set at 3.3%, and
- □ To provide local districts with the SSI Benefit Levels Chart effective January 1, 2007.

II. Background

Every year, the Social Security Administration (SSA) adjusts RSDI (Title II - regular Social Security) and federal SSI (Title XVI - Supplemental Security Income) benefits to reflect the increase in the cost of living. This increase is based on the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between the third quarter of the current year and the third quarter of the previous year.

The January 1, 2007 COLA for RSDI and federal SSI benefits has been set at 3.3%. As authorized by Chapter 515 of the Laws of 2006, the full amount of the 2007 federal COLA will be passed along to all recipients of an optional or mandatory SSI State supplement.

In addition to receiving a pass-through of the federal COLA provided by Chapter 515, Part C of Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2006 established a COLA on the State share of the SSI benefit for recipients in Enhanced Residential Care – Congregate Care Level 3 facilities. Therefore, Level 3 residents will also receive an increase in the State supplement component of their monthly SSI grant.

As noted last year, Chapters 25, 58 and 713 of the Laws of 2005 reclassified *adult homes* and *enriched housing programs* from the Congregate Care Level 2 to the Congregate Care Level 3 category. Effective January 1, 2007, Chapter 58 also increased the State supplement component of the Level 3 rate and removed the current geographic distinctions so that there will be a single Statewide Level 3 rate starting on January 1, 2007.

The attached *SSI Benefit Levels for 2007* chart reflects the 3.3% federal COLA increase and all the statutory changes noted above. It is provided as a resource for informational purposes. The chart can also be viewed on CentraPort under Desk Guides and on the OTDA Intranet site within the Division of Employment and Transitional Supports under Desk Guides/Aids.

The increases in client income of Temporary Assistance and Food Stamp recipients will be addressed by the annual Mass Rebudgeting. See ABEL Transmittal 06-4 for more information about the annual Mass Rebudgeting.

The combined federal and State SSI benefit provided to eligible individuals and eligible couples with no countable income.

The Living With Others category includes recipients whose federal benefit has been reduced by the "value of the 1/3 reduction" (VTR) due to the federal determination that they are both: a) living in someone else's household, and b) receiving some amount of free or subsidized food and shelter (room and board).

Applies when an SSI recipient is residing in a medical facility, is not expected to return home within 90 days, and Medicaid is paying for at least 50% of the cost of care.

Recipients in nursing homes licensed by DOH receive an additional monthly grant of \$25 issued by OTDA called a State Supplemental Personal Needs Allowance (SSPNA). Residents of other medical facilities receive an SSPNA of \$5.

This zero federally-administered State supplement applies: *a)* when an SSI recipient is residing in a private medical facility and Medicaid is paying for less than 50% of the cost of care, *or b)* when a recipient resides in certain publicly operated residential facilities serving 16 or fewer residents, *or c)* while a recipient resides in a public emergency shelter for 6 calendar months during a 9 month period.
