The Department of Health and Human Services recently published its annual update of the HHS poverty guidelines to account for last (calendar) year's increase in prices as measured by the Consumer Price Index. The attached chart reflects this increase in the Federal Poverty Guidelines. The figures on the chart represent 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a given family size, both by month and by annual income. These revised figures are effective **June 1, 2007 through May 31, 2008.** 

The revised chart should be utilized when determining eligibility for programs funded through the provisions outlined in 00 LCM-20, "TANF Services for Individuals and Families with Incomes at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level". Please make sure that both your local district staff and contracted service providers are made aware of the revised chart.
