## DIGEST OF LAWS OF 2007 RELATING TO PROGRAMS OF THE OFFICE OF TEMPORARY AND DISABILITY ASSISTANCE

## **NOTICE**

The purpose of this digest is to highlight provisions of the Laws of 2007 and to direct interested persons to the appropriate provisions of the law. <u>This Digest is neither</u> designed nor intended to be used as a substitute for the law itself nor is it intended to be considered as the Office's interpretation of these laws for the purposes of implementation.

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#### **TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE**

#### <u>Chapter 123 – Extending the Effectiveness of Income and Resource Exemptions</u> [A. 7228]

Extends to August 22, 2009, the effectiveness of a certain provision of the Welfare Reform Act of 1997 (Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1997), concerning the exemption of income and resources in determining eligibility for and the amounts of certain benefits.

#### Statues involved:

Social Services Law Section 131-n

Effective date: July 3, 2007.

#### <u>Chapter 132 – Increasing Standards of Monthly Need –</u> <u>Aged, Blind and Disabled Persons</u> [A. 7949-A]

To increase the standards of need for eligibility and payment of additional State payments to the aged, blind and disabled to reflect any Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefit increase during the first half of calendar year 2008.

#### Statutes involved:

Social Services Law Section 131-o (1) (a)(b)(d) and (e) Section 209 (2) (a)(b)(c)(d)(e)(f) and (g)

**Effective date**: December 31, 2007, provided that the amendments to Section 131-o (1)(e) and Section 209 (2)(g) shall not affect the expiration of such paragraphs and shall expire therewith.

#### <u>Chapter 135 – Expanding Resources Available for Working Families to Access</u> <u>Child Care in Lieu of Public Assistance Benefits</u> [A. 8096]

To allow working families the option of receiving child care subsidies in lieu of public assistance benefits.

Statutes involved: Social Services Law Section 410-w (4)(a)

Effective date: July 3, 2007.

## <u>Chapter 326 – Participation and Exemptions</u> <u>in Public Assistance Work Requirements</u> [S. 4547]

To foreclose public assistance recipients from counting time spent caring for a disabled household member as time spent participating in community service for work participation rate purposes. This amendment was necessitated by the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 and Interim Final regulations issued by the federal Department of Health and Human Services.

#### Statutes involved:

Social Services Law Section 332 (1)(c)

**Effective date**: July 18, 2007, and shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on and after October 1, 2006.

#### <u>Chapter 598 Calculation of the Shelter Allowance for Individuals and Families</u> <u>Receiving Public Assistance and Residing in Public Housing</u> [A. 7905]

To amend the shelter allowance for individuals and families receiving public assistance and residing in city, state or federal public housing.

#### Statutes involved:

Social Services Law Section 131-a (2) (c)(d) and (e)

Effective date: August 15, 2007.

#### CHILD SUPPORT

## <u>Chapter 59, Part J – Enforcement of Child Support</u> <u>Through the Suspension of Driving Privileges</u> [S. 2109-C]

Extends the provisions authorizing the administrative suspension of driving privileges as a result of non-payment of child support, through June 30, 2009.

#### Statutes involved:

Social Services Law Section 111-b (12) Vehicle and Traffic Law Section 510 Section 530 (5) and (5-a) Family Court Act Section 439 (a) Section 454 (5)

**Effective date:** April 9, 2007, and shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on or after April 1, 2007.

## <u>Chapter 60. Part C – State Partnership for Child Support Enforcement and</u> <u>Collection</u> [S. 2110-C]

Made permanent the child support enforcement partnership between the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance and the Department of Taxation and Finance by eliminating the provision of an expiration date of the authority of the Department of Taxation and Finance to collect unpaid child support.

#### Statutes involved:

Social Services Law Section 111-b (15) and (16) Section 111-h (19) Tax Law Section 171-i

Effective date: April 9, 2007.

## <u>Chapter 310 – Felony Offense for Non-Support of a Child</u> [S3844-A]

To amend the Penal Law to provide for predicate felony offense of non-support of a child.

#### Statutes involved:

Penal Law Section 260.06

Effective date: November 1, 2007.

## <u>Chapter 462 – Acknowledgments of Paternity</u> [S4780-A]

To amend the Family Court Act in relation to acknowledgments of paternity.

## Statutes involved:

Family Court Act Section 516-a (b) & (c)

Effective date: October 30, 2007.

## ADMINISTRATION

## <u>Chapter 133 – Guide Dogs, Hearing Dogs and Service Dogs –</u> <u>Clarifying Provisions</u> [A. 7952]

To clarify provisions of the Human Rights Law concerning the use of guide dogs, hearing dogs and service dogs.

## **Statutes involved:**

Executive Law Section 292 (31), (32) and (33) Section 296 (14)

Effective date: October 1, 2007

#### <u>Chapter 279 – Abandonment of Moneys Paid in Advance of the Provision of</u> <u>Funeral Merchandise and Services</u> [S. 961-A]

Provides that under certain circumstances, pre-need administrators would transfer the assets of abandoned or dormant funeral/burial accounts to county indigent care burial funds.

#### **Statutes involved:**

General Business Law Section 453 (10) and (11)

Effective date: January 1, 2008

## <u>Chapter 407 – New York Codes, Rules and Regulations – Internet</u> [A.7885-A]

To require the NYS Department of State to post or maintain a link on its website to an unofficial version of the New York State Codes, Rules and Regulations, at no cost to the user.

#### Statutes involved:

Executive Law Section 106-a

Effective date: January 1, 2008.

# <u>Chapter 455 – The Use of Certain Language and Terminology when Dealing with</u> <u>Certain Issues</u>

[S4073-A]

All new and revised statutes, local laws, ordinances, charters or regulations promulgated or any publication published by the state or any political subdivision that refers to persons with disabilities shall seek to avoid certain language, and utilize language that refers to persons with disabilities as persons first (e.g., individuals with disabilities, etc.).

#### Statutes involved:

Effective date: August 1, 2007.

## <u>Chapter 601 – Transferring Certain Functions of the Department of Social Services</u> <u>to the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance</u> [A. 8094]

Consistent with the Welfare reform Act of 1997 (Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1997), transfers certain functions from the Department of Social Services to the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance.

**Effective date:** August 15, 2007, provided, however: that provisions pertaining to Section 171-i of the Tax Law shall not affect the repeal of such section and shall be deemed repealed therewith; and further provided that provisions pertaining to Section 454 (5) of the Family Court Act shall not affect the repeal of such subdivision and shall be deemed repealed therewith; and further provided that provisions pertaining to Section 510 (4-e) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law shall not affect the repeal of such subdivision and shall be deemed repealed therewith; and further provided that provisions pertaining to Section 510 (4-e) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law shall not affect the repeal of such subdivision and shall be deemed repealed therewith; and further provided that provisions pertaining to Section 7.09 (g) of the Mental Hygiene Law shall survive the expiration and reversion of such subdivision as provided in Section 2 of Part I of Chapter 58 of the Laws of 2005, as amended.

## <u>Chapter 74 – To Amend the Law in Relation to Human Trafficking</u> [S5902]

To Amend Certain State Laws Relating to Human Trafficking and to Patronizing a Prostitute.

**Effective date**: November 1, 2007; except that Social Services Law Section 483-ee shall take effect immediately, and remain in effect until September 1, 2011, when upon such date the provisions of such section shall expire and be deemed repealed. Provided, effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the timely implementation of the provisions of Social Services Law Article 10-D, as added by section eleven of this act, on its effective date are authorized to be made on or before such effective date.

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
