Section 2

I. Purpose

- □ To inform local districts that there is no cost of living adjustment (COLA) for RSDI (Title II regular and disability Social Security benefits) and SSI (Title XVI Supplemental Security Income) for January 1, 2010.
- □ To provide local districts with the SSI Benefit Levels Chart effective January 1, 2010.

II. Background

Every year, the Social Security Administration (SSA) adjusts RSDI and federal SSI benefits to reflect the increase in the cost of living. This increase is based on the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between the third quarter of the current year and the third quarter of the previous year. This year there was no increase in the CPI from the third quarter of 2008 to the third quarter of 2009. With consumer prices down over the past year, monthly Social Security and Supplemental Security Income benefits will not automatically increase in 2010. Since there is no COLA, the statute prohibits an increase in the maximum amount of earnings subject to the Social Security tax as well as the retirement earnings test exempt amounts. These amounts will remain unchanged in 2010.

The attached SSI Benefit Levels for 2010 chart reflects the 0% federal COLA. It is provided as a resource for informational purposes. The chart can also be viewed on CentraPort under Desk Guides and on the OTDA Intranet site within the Center for Employment and Economic Supports under Desk Guides/Aids.

Due to the 0% COLA for Social Security and SSI income, there will NOT be a mass rebudgeting of federal benefit income of Temporary Assistance and Food Stamp recipients.

The Medicare Part B basic premium will remain at \$96.40 per month for beneficiaries who were enrolled and had the premium deducted from their Social Security payment prior to January 1, 2010, and whose annual income is not above \$85,000 for a single person or \$170,000 for a married couple. Beneficiaries who first enroll in Medicare Part B in 2010, and Part B enrollees who do not have their Part B premium deducted from their Social Security payment (e.g., their premium is paid for them by Medicaid or Medicare Buy-In), will be charged \$110.50 per month. Food Stamp applicants and recipients who incur unreimbursed out-of-pocket costs for Medicare Part B premiums must have the actual monthly cost allowed as a Food Stamp medical deduction.

The combined federal and State SSI benefit provided to eligible individuals and eligible couples with no countable income.

The Living With Others category includes recipients whose federal benefit has been reduced by the "value of the 1/3 reduction" (VTR) due to the federal determination that they are both: a) living in someone else's household, and b) receiving some amount of free or subsidized food and shelter (room and board).

Applies when an SSI recipient is residing in a medical facility, is not expected to return home within 90 days, and Medicaid is paying for at least 50% of the cost of care.

Recipients in nursing homes licensed by DOH receive an additional monthly grant of \$25 issued by OTDA called a State Supplemental Personal Needs Allowance (SSPNA). Residents of other medical facilities receive an SSPNA of \$5.

This zero federally-administered State supplement applies: *a)* when an SSI recipient is residing in a private medical facility and Medicaid is paying for less than 50% of the cost of care, *or b)* when a recipient resides in certain publicly operated residential facilities serving 16 or fewer residents, *or c)* while a recipient resides in a public emergency shelter for 6 calendar months during a 9 month period.
