The Department is in the process of developing an informational booklet on activities undertaken by the Department and local districts to prevent fraud in our social services programs. This booklet is part of a continuing effort to provide the public with a better understanding of the programs and services administered by the state and local departments of social services, and will be similar to our earlier publications entitled "Twenty Frequently Asked Questions About New York State's Social Services Program" and "Where Does the Money Go?". Comments we have received from local commissioners and others have indicated these publications have provided factual information which has assisted in dispelling some of the misinformation and misperceptions the public has about the costs and beneficiaries of our programs.

The fraud prevention booklet will include summary descriptions of the many fraud prevention and control activities undertaken by the Department and local districts including the Front End Detection System (FEDS), the Medicaid Utilization Threshold and Recipient Restriction programs, computer data matches for unreported income and assets, the pilot fingerprinting program, and the various activities focused on Medicaid providers.
